Sandbanks Beach | 27th September - 2nd October | 7:00 - 23:00


'In Memoriam' by Luke Jerram offers a place for the public to remember those we have lost in the COVID-19 pandemic. A display of bed sheets creates a symbolic sea of flags to reflect loved ones passed, and pays tribute to brave NHS staff members and volunteers.

WINDBREAK BY COLD WAR STEVE

Boscombe Beach | 25th September - 4th October | 7:00 - 23:00

Art is making a bold escape from the confines of white box galleries as Cold War Steve embarks on a UK wide, outdoor art installation.

This subversive new voice in the art world is taking a provocative look at the state of art, politics, and the true psyche of post-lockdown Britain through his work, as he literally brings art to the masses with a number of large-scale displays throughout the country.

Birmingham-based artist, Cold War Steve's satirical collages have made him a cult phenomenon, particularly on social media, but he is also highly regarded in the art world being celebrated as the 'Brexit Bruegel' and 'a modern-day Hogarth'. His work can be challenging, provocative and provoke mixed reactions in viewers – and the Bournemouth artwork is already causing debate.

Originally featuring a Bournemouth beach scene on one side, including notable good people, hopeful themes and a giant 'welcome' mat facing the sea, the piece also had a dark side featuring all your favourite villains in a dystopian nightmare complete with evil sand worms and Nazis. The dark side has now been covered for the duration of the Bournemouth leg of the tour because of its potential to cause offence. Head to our 'News' page to understand more about the debate.


THE CONGREGATION BY GUY DOWSETT



AN EXCITING SERIES OF WORKSHOPS & AN OPPORTUNITY TO BE PART OF ARTS BY THE SEA FESTIVAL!

Local arts and wellbeing organisation, CoCreate is inviting those who have been affected by events related to COVID-19 to take part in Arts by the Sea. Inspired by the themes of In Memoriam by Luke Jerram, Process is a community artwork project that offers the chance to explore your own feelings and experiences from the last few months through a series of creative workshops in writing, theatre and visual art. The subsequent artworks developed – made from pillowcases, reflecting the use of bedsheets used by In Memoriam – will be displayed at the festival.

WHO CAN TAKE PART?

If you feel like taking part in creative activity could benefit you at this time, perhaps as a way to help make sense of recent events related to the challenges COVID 19, then we would love you to be part of this project. You must be over 18, and will need to be available in September and be committed to take part in up to 12 creative workshops developing a piece for display in the festival – you can choose how many sessions you do, but we expect participants to attend at least 4.

We know that the COVID-19 crisis has affected people in different ways, and we will work with you to tailor sessions to meet your needs. We might run sessions online, in a park, over the phone, through the post – wherever you're at.

We want to find a way to involve anyone who wants to take part!

Do you like music, art and festivals? And are you aged 18–25 years old? Arts by the Sea is working in partnership with Emergency Exit Arts to give aspiring young creatives the skills and knowledge to kickstart a career in the outdoor arts sector. And you'll help programme our festival in 2021!

Our Trainee Producers Scheme consists of a series of workshops that will run over 12 months from October 2020. They are free to take part in with paid expenses for participants. Over the course of the programme, you will learn several skills needed to successfully produce events in the outdoor arts sector as we navigate events post-lockdown and Covid-19. Each session will explore a new topic including; What makes a good outdoor event; How to identify your target audience; and Successful finance management. Plus, at the end of the scheme, the group will commission part of the art

programme for Arts by the Sea 2021.


